# What kind of world do we want to live in?

What kind of world do we want to live in?

That is the question which is confronting all of us today. Our lives are still wracked by economic inequality, social strife and environmental catastrophe.

We cannot continue to live like that. It is a great need to change the situation.

We talk a lot about poverty and under-privileged children and health. We try to help in various ways and invest our time, knowledge and funds. We certainly doing well, and we are happy about our activities.

Do we measure of an action's benefit to society? This question becomes more important and we must shift this question to the center of our mind.

Can education fight the poverty? The answer is yes but...can we do more?

Travelling around Asia in various countries and advising private schools in various programs I found one unique school in Jakarta. It was "WOW' factor discovery. It is different from any other project I knew, participated and wrote about. I could not stop myself to go to that school and learn more.

When I came to the school I was surrounded by the large family of friendly students of different age. They also looked different as they come from different provinces of Indonesia. They came to Jakarta to this school from low-income families...Under-privileged children...Yayasan Prima Unggul (YPU)

YPU has a mission to create independent individuals arising from under-privilege children. Through employing national education system through home-schooling and entrepreneurship-based education system, YPU creates independent individuals, giving positive impacts to the society.

It was painful to listen to personal stories of children and why they have been moved to Jakarta from Ambon and Flores, from Sumatra and some other remote islands of Indonesia. But seeing them living as one big family I knew the mission serves the purpose.

The poverty cycle is broken and the mentality "to be poor" has been changed. Studying through home schooling system and in Open University, children are proactive and creative in their learning process. Students at senior level teach their juniors. YPU has no employee, hence students must take care of themselves and each other, including feeding the younger children, given them a bath, and others. One distinct difference at YPU is teaching children to

be financially independent through operating YPU's business units by themselves. YPU's business units are able to finance 70% of the children livelihood. YPU has several business units such as catering, performing arts, training center, and others. Is not that unique? It certainly is.

I had delicious food prepared by the students, we made music by playing different instruments, we were dancing and singing. It was an amazing experience! When I was leaving YPU, these lovely kids asked me to help them to perform outside of Indonesia. They did not ask for money!!! They asked

me to give them a chance to perform in some Rotary events. I liked that approach — "please give us a chance...we have plenty of opportunities around us...we must realize an opportunity to perform..."

CAN WE GIVE THEM A CHANCE? – I had great support from President Mark and Secretary Connie – "Why not to invite them to Kuching for Pan Borneo? Let's all Rotarians from Singapore help YPU to come to Kuching". I wrote to PDG Andre and the Pan Borneo Meet Committee – and got the answer "YES".

The YPU group will perform at the Welcome Dinner and Governor's Banquet. The chance has been given.

We need some funds to bring this group from Jakarta to Kuching and cover their travel and accommodation expenses.

My fellow Rotarians, let's collect funds to help this group of young performers. Impact of entrepreneurs are powerful allies and we should support their efforts! 

**Speaker:** Associate Professor Dr A Lee Gilbert,

**Nanyang Business School** 

**Topic:** *"From Belief to Success – learning from Asian* 

Start-ups"

Rtn Dr Hoon Sing Keow was called upon by President Mark to introduce the Speaker, Associate Professor Dr A Lee Gilbert. Rtn Sing Keow advised that Dr Gilbert earned his doctorate from Northeastern University in Boston, writing and defending a dissertation based on his field work, entitled "Planning for International Information Technology Transfers.

At Harvard Business School, he served as Fellow for Future Information Systems Faculty, while researching, writing, and teaching cases. In Asia, he led Executive Education for the new Institute of Systems Science at the National University of Singapore, and later joined the Nanyang Business School, where he led two innovative MBA programs: International Business and Management of IT.

Before starting on his presentation, Dr Gilbert advised that he was grateful to Rotary for the scholarship he received which enabled him to graduate. Dr Gilbert advised that

his presentation would focus on some young Asia-based companies, and explore factors that would help them succeed, and those that threaten their continued existence.

In his presentation, Dr Gilbert highlighted ten startups which he studied, and then moved on to a deeper analysis of three of these firms, to understand the main obstacles they faced and how they overcame these barriers.

To conclude his talk, Dr Gilbert called on members to play the role of potential investors, and apply a simple checklist that should help in deciding on which of these young firms we should place our bet. Following a brief poll of members' opinions, Dr Gilbert graciously answered questions from members.

President Mark called on Rtn Bala Venkatesan who warmly thanked Dr Gilbert for his presentation which gave a wonderful perspective as well as his sharing of knowledge of start-ups.

Of the things we think, say or do:

Is it fair to all concerned?

Will it build goodwill and better friendship?
Will it be beneficial to all concerned?

Is it the truth?
