

Topic: "Singapore and the Netherlands, old friends and

young innovators"



In his introduction of Ambassador Vonno, Rtn Uttam Kripalani recalled their meeting, as well as his assignment in Rotterdam and The Hague with its below zero degrees temperature and howling winds.

That aside, Rtn Uttam was delighted to introduce Ambassador Vonno who has been in Singapore since August 2017. She has had a distinguished career in various Ministerial Departments including Infrastructure and Environment and Foreign Affairs.

Rtn Uttam Kripalani Ambassador Vonno has a Masters degree in International Relations from Utrecht and an MBA from the Rotterdam School of Management.

Ambassador Vonno gave a *Speaker, HE Ambassador Vonno* succinct presentation and overview of her country. She spoke of the recent State Visit of President Halimah Yacob to the Netherlands, which focused on Innovation. She also looked back on the Dutch-Singaporean history from the friendship of Mr Lee Kuan Yew and Dr Albert Winsemius to the Dutch residence at the Dempsey area that was recently renovated.

Ambassador Vonno noted that both the Netherlands and Singapore are smart nations and highlighted some examples of interesting start-ups and testbeds from autonomous driving, to waste management to FinTech.
