

**Speaker:** Mr Leong Chee Tung,

**CEO**, EngageRocket

**Topic:** "People Analytics and the Future of Work"

PP Perlita Tiro was given the task of introducing the Speaker, Mr Leong Chee Tung, the CEO of EngageRocket, an Human Resource tech startup that helps to automate employee feedback and analytics, which has traditionally been carried out through an arduous manual exercise. PP Perlita added that before becoming an entrepreneur, Mr Leong was Regional Director of well-known international survey firm, Gallup for Southeast Asia. He read Economics at the University of Cambridge and has an MA in Political Science from Columbia University under SAF Overseas Scholarship.

She also noted that his company, EngageRocket has heen named one of 20 Hottest Startups in 2018 by the Singapore Buisiness Review and has been featured in multiple outlets.



Members were informed that the purpose of Mr Leong's talk was mainly to demystify the concept of people analytics. Mr Leong started his presentation by first highlighting the findings of a survey for characterising life experience. He continued with the three main areas of the management revolution brought on by "Big Data", such as the volume of data now available. He advised that more data has been generated in 2017 than in the previous 5,000 years of human history. Mr Leong noted the tremendous velocity achieved, that more data has passed through the internet than was stored in the entire web just 10 years ago, as well as the variety of available technology.

Rtn Horst called upon Rtn Dr Claus Dusemund who warmly thanked Mr Leong for the pleasure of listening to his talk and added that he was very pleased that his presentation was not over loaded with text but was highlighted with his explanation instead.
