During 2019-2020, I am encouraging Rotarians and Rotaractors to grow Rotary. We must grow our service, we must grow the impact of our projects, but, most importantly, we must grow our membership so that we can achieve more.

Let us try a new approach to membership, one that is more organized and strategic. I am asking every club to form an active membership committee consisting of people of different backgrounds who will look methodically at the leadership of the community.

Your club's membership committee will then apply Rotary's classification system — designed to ensure that the range of professions in your community is well represented — to identify potential leaders with the skill, the talent, and the character that will strengthen your club. If your club's membership committee is unsure how to proceed, look to the club membership committee checklist on Rotary.org for clearly defined steps to organizing its work.

How else will we connect to grow Rotary? We will also form new types of clubs — either independent clubs or satellite clubs — with different meeting experiences and engaging service opportunities, not just where there is no Rotary, but also where Rotary is already thriving. No Rotary club in the world can possibly serve all segments of its community. Therefore, we must organize new clubs to engage the community leaders who cannot connect with our existing clubs.

Growing Rotary is all about taking the connections that make our organization unique in the world and strengthening and multiplying them. Let us commit ourselves to growing Rotary and to welcoming the next diverse generation of women and men as *Rotary Connects the World*.

Speakers: Mr Kamal Dollah

Winner of the Club's Artisan of the Year Award 2019

Topic: "The Art of Batik-Painting"

President Deepak called on Rtn Vishal Nanwani to introduce the Guest Speaker, Mr Kamal Dollah. Rtn Vishal recounted that as with all good things in his life, his chance meeting with Mr Kamal came about through his wife, Sonam, just one week prior to his being the Chairman of the Artisan of the Year Award Committee.

Mr Kamal Dollah is a Singaporean artist specializing in batik-painting and caricature drawings. He was trained at Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts and later attained Master of Arts degree in Contemporary Practice from the University of Huddersfield (UK) in

2007 with his thesis entitled "Innovating Tradition – Batik Painting in Contemporary Art Practice".

Mr Kamal gave an insightful explanation of batik and how it is very much a part of the South East Asian culture. He spoke of the various batik techniques used in batik making such as transference, printing and layering and the special tools involved in the processes. Mr Kamal also showed some examples of batik paintings from renowned artists such as Chua Thean Teng, Seah Kim Joo, Jaafar Latif and Sarkasi Said as well as some of his pieces of batik art.

Mr Kamal highlighted some of the community workshops he conducted to engage senior citizens as well as the disabled. He spoke of the introduction of batik to the young and the promotion of eco-dye. He further related how his last year's project of the longest batik painting brought many member of the community together. To end his presentation, Mr Kamal graciously answered questions posed to him.

President Deepak invited PP Stan Low, one of the judges of the Artisan of the Year Award, to extend the vote of thanks to Mr Kamal on behalf of

the Club. PP Stan noted that the contest was very tight for the Award; however Mr Kamal was the clear winner, who personified the 4-Way Test message with his bringing of the community together and benefitting society.
