# Global Grant Project Visits to Vietnam 7-10 January 2020

RC Singapore and the District International Service Committee (DISC) jointly organized an overseas Global Grant Projects Visit to Vietnam in January 2020. A total of 30 participants from District 3310 included 24 Rotarians and 6 Family Members. RC Singapore's contingent of 9 was led by senior Past President Mansoor Hassanbhai and included PP Jimmy Ooi, PN See Mee Lee, Rtn Toshi Kimura, Rtn Sylvia Chung and PP Dr Shahul Hameed, plus 3 Family Members.

The delegation visited 3 Project sites at 3 different locations. First off was the Economic Livelihood Global Grant for improving the lives of the poor and disabled in Quang Tri Village. This involved assistance to 100 Families who were given training and guidance for chicken rearing, from the provision of live chicks, building of chicken coops, care, treatment and chicken feed, to the eventual sale of the full grown chickens for sustenance. This USD\$58,000 project is done in conjunction with RC Maumee, USA and RC Queenstown, Singapore.





The group next revisited RC Singapore's inaugural Vietnam Project that was approved in 2017. This is a Water and Sanitation Project for a remote mountain village known as Hong Nguyen Commune located about 2 hours drove from the city of Hue in Central Vietnam. This Project provided clean treated and fluoridated water to 316 household in the village including the local kindergarten with 70 preschool children. The project also funded 53 latrines for 53 households. RC Singapore received further requests to assist in structural enhancements to the Kindergarten as well as another Global Grant to provide for 100 latrines for the village households.

# Global Grant Project Visits to Vietnam...contd

The final project is a Classroom Library project for 16 Elementary Schools in Cam Lo Province near the Laos Border in Vietnam. This project provides easy access for the learning of English for over 4,000 elementary school pupils from 16 Schools in the area. This USD\$36,000 project is done in conjunction with District 6600, USA and RC Marina City. We look forward to supporting more such Libraries in Schools in the region and also to explore a Teacher Training Global Grant in view of capacity building for the English Teachers in these Schools.

Speaker: Mr Kurt Wee

Topic: "Outlook 2020"



President Deepak called on Vice President (VP) Bala Venkatesan to introduce the Speaker, Mr Kurt Wee. VP Bala noted that Mr Wee has a career spanning the last 20 years in the investment and private equity industry. He is invested in medical and biotechnology fields of stem cells and small cells research. He is the Chief Executive Officer of Celligenics Pte Ltd and also serves as an Independent Director of Beng Soon Machinery Holdings Limited (listed in Hong Kong Stock Exchange).



He is the President of the Association of Small & Medium Enterprises (ASME) – the Club's joint organiser of the Entrepreneur of the Year Award (EYA) and a council member of the Singapore Business Federation where is also chairs the SBF SME Committee. Kurt also serves on the executive council of Singapore Children's Society, where he has chaired the Appeals (fundraising) Committee since 2008.

Mr Wee gave an overview of the local economy and the perspectives of the small and medium enterprises in Singapore as well as the global regional landscape, particularly that of China. He noted the local matrix for Singapore's businesses was changing and companies would have to deliver good leadership in coaching and grooming staff. Mr Wee expects better schemes to be introduced following the Government's Budget announcement.

To end his talk, Mr Wee shared his concerns on climate change and its detrimental effects which would wipe out a vast section of the world's population.

President Deepak invited PP Alan Tan to extend the Club's vote of thanks to Mr Wee. In doing so, PP Alan not only

thanked Mr Wee for his excellent talk but also for his unwavering support for the Club's EYA project.


