In Focus

A Basic Human Right

Clean water. Yes, that is what it is. But not everyone is afforded or accorded this right. To bring out this issue and to focus upon it, Rotary International has designated the month of March as "Water & Sanitation Month".

It does seem out of place for us in Singapore to talk about having clean water and good sanitation. Redundant. Because we have it all at our finger tips — water to drink straight from the tap and flush systems that work. Indeed, we are fortunate to be in this First World state.

But there are countless other countries not as lucky as us. Even our close neighbours. These are places where Rotary and The Rotary Foundation (TRF) comes in, in a great way.

We – everyone – know that clean water, good sanitation and hygiene are "basic necessities for a healthy environment and a productive life". People who have access to clean water have less to fear about water borne diseases. They are generally healthier. In so many Third World countries a lot of time is spent collecting water from rivers and common wells, in many cases quite distant from their houses. If piped water were provided, the time saved could be spent with the family.

Rotary's WASH (Water, Sanitation and Hygiene) Programme is aimed towards all that. In partnership with local and district clubs, government agencies, NGO's, UNICEF, World Vision and the Red Cross – in the process overcoming religious and sectarian divides – Rotary and TRF help to provide the means to have access to safe, clean water and sanitation in so many countries. Local fund-raising and TRF grants facilitate the successful implementation of such programmes. Countries like Ghana, Uganda, Madagascar, Belize, Honduras, India, Kenya, the Philippines, and others are the beneficiaries. Over 1000 WASH programmes in more than 100 countries have been carried out since 2013. Rotary said, "US\$24 is all it takes to provide one person with safe water". The target date to provide everyone with safe water, good sanitation and proper hygiene is 2030. This will be possible only if the implemented programmes are sustainable.

The question Rotary asks now is: "What is your club doing towards this end?"



In Focus

Judging from some rather alarming information on the current situation, issued by the World Health Organisation (WHO) some months ago, there is so much to do. I quote a few facts:

- 2 billion people still do not have basic sanitation facilities such as toilets and latrines;
- Some 673 million still defecate in the open for example in street gutters, behind bushes or into open bodies of water;
- ❖ At least 10% of the world's population consume polluted water;
- Poor sanitation is linked to the transmission of water-borne diseases like cholera, diarrhoea, dysentery, hepatitis A, typhoid and polio.
- Over 800,000 diarrhoeal deaths annually resulted.

In this scenario, children are the most vulnerable.

The lucky ones like us often take clean water for granted. We use and waste so much of it in our daily activities such as bathing, flushing the toilet, filling our water bottles and drink a little and pour out the balance. Not to mention washing the car, watering the garden We waste a lot of good precious water without thinking twice about it.

In 2010, the UN General Assembly declared explicitly that it is a human right to have clean water and proper sanitation.

Rotary has chipped in, in no small measure, particularly in Sub-Saharian Africa and South Asia. Our club has embarked on such programmes and projects in South-east Asia.

The good news is that over 2.6 billion people have been given access to clean water. In terms of real numbers and percentages, the progress made so far has not been spectacular. But progress there has been, and we should be thankful for that. However, it is emphasized that "it is still crucial that we continue to push forward clean water initiatives".

Some initiatives: help to generate awareness; participate in "World Water Day" (22 March 2020) and "World Toilet Day" (22 November 2020) activities; encourage research and development in good water resources governance; and not waste water.

Especially during this "Water & Sanitation Month".

Mr Pardey introduced his organization BSF as

an Asian Sports Charity that provides a variety of sporting opportunities to disadvantaged and disabled children and adults in Indonesia, funded by sponsorships and donations.

Mr. Pardey's presented BSF's vision and mission to improve the lives of those with disabilities in Indonesia by using the power of sport and play for development, health and peace. He cited the benefits of the Foundation's work and gave a summary of their sports programmes.

Mr Pardey explained how members could support BSF's mission and how funding would be utilized for expanding their sports programmes to a greater number of participants; purchase and maintenance of equipment tailored to the disabled and sending individuals and teams to competitions. He added that BSF's trustees donated their time and expertise free of charge and the monthly operating costs for BSF was only US\$2500. Mr Pardey highlighted the many achievements of the Foundation as well as the testimonies from the athletes who have benefitted from their sports programmes.

President Deepak called on Rtn Dr Claus Dusemund who thanked Mr Pardey for his presentation and efforts which exemplified Rotary's motto of "Service Above Self".




