Covid 19 Pandemic Response GG 2012660 Singapore

I am pleased to inform you that the distribution of items for Rotary GG 2012660 Covid 19 items for Singapore is now underway. I would like to thank all our 23 Singapore and 28 overseas Rotary Clubs and Districts* for their kind assistance and support. All Clubs and Districts are kindly acknowledged in the Official Banner for the Project.

Just a recap: this GG, worth USD\$132,249 (SGD\$188,351), supports the following items for donation to the Ministry of Health, Singapore.

- (i) 18,000 Disposable Face shields from Super Pak Manufacturing in Tuas, Singapore valued at SGD\$46,224
- (ii) 4,827 pieces of AAMI Level 3/4 Surgical Gowns sourced from Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, valued at SGD\$96,772

And, to be **distributed to the Community in Singapore**, especially to the low-income essential service workers, front line healthcare care workers as well as residents as social welfare homes and organisations:

(iii) 30,000 Reusable Facemasks valued at SGD\$36,400

On **18 September 2020,** 5 Rotarians from RC Bugis Junction and RC Singapore, representing the Rotary Clubs and Districts sponsoring this GG 2012660, inspected the 18,000 Disposable Face shield items that are ready for donation to the Ministry of Health, Singapore.

Following is an extract of the eulogy delivered by PP Stan Low at the weekly meeting of 7 October 2020

I first met Honorary Member, Shoichi Ishizaki in 1984, almost 36 years ago. He had been my very good friend since then. We had happy times serving The Rotary Club of Singapore. Together, we helped many people during the Kobe Earthquake in 1995 and the Fukushima Tsunami in 2011. I remember his generosity and contributions to various humanitarian projects in Singapore and other countries in Asia.

Shoichi had many friends in the Rotary Club of Singapore. He served in several positions, including Vice-President. He was bestowed Honorary Member, the highest membership class in our Club. But he was most remembered as our energetic Ambassador to our Japanese sister-clubs, like the Rotary Clubs of Kobe East, Wakayama East, and Osaka Semba.

In 1982, he helped to organize the first visit to Japan by 40 Rotarians and wives. Honorary Member and Past President Dr Patrick Chin, remembers this visit like it was only yesterday. Shoichi san worked very hard to make sure that everyone felt comfortable and the food was excellent. He even made sure that our Vegetarian member, K.S.Mehta, was provided with vegetarian food for every meal. His other good friends, like Adam Moledina, Philbert Chin, Saf Hussain, Bhagwan Melwani, J.K. Ong, and Rewa Mirpuri, were all grateful to him for his kindness and hospitality. Since that first visit in 1982, he had managed every visit to our sister-clubs. He continued to make sure that every visit was memorable. We thank him very much.

Besides our time serving in the Rotary Club, Shoichi and I had many fun times together. We went out to try new restaurants. We also went out to golf. We knew he loved to golf. COMMITTEE HOSTING & SISTER CLUB EVENT FEES

President Dinesh announced the decision made at the Board meeting on the 5th of October as follows:

- Not charge hosting fees until we do resume physical Committee meetings. Based on the decision in July, invoices went out including hosting fees; all members who have already settled their invoices will get a credit for the hosting fee charge, valid for the time until we resume physical meetings or for the full Rotary year 2021/22, whatever may apply. Members who have not yet settled their invoices, please only pay the annual fee and the RI Convention contribution of SGD 180. Hosting fees that may apply when we resume physical meetings will be invoiced when we are at this stage.
- Given the current very restricted travel scenario, it is highly unlikely that the traditional Sister Club event before the Installation Function is going to happen in 2021. As such, the SGD 120.00 fee for this event which has been invoiced to International Service Committee (ISC) members will be refunded to those members who have already paid. All other members, please disregard this charge.

KYFR KNOW YOUR FELLOW ROTARIAN



President Dinesh called upon Rtn Pia Bruce, the next member for the KYFR programme. Rtn Pia advised that she is Swedish. An interesting fact Rtn Pia shared was that her mother met Rtn Dr Hoon Sing Keow at a Rotary meeting in Sweden in the 1980s. She studied in the US and was sent for an internship at the United Nations. Rtn Pia came to Singapore in 2004 and has two teenage boys.

GUEST SPEAKER: LENA NG TOPIC: WOMEN LEADERSHP N CHAOS

Rtn Louisa Lee was called upon by President Dinesh to introduce the speaker, Ms Lena Ng who is the Chief Investment Officer for Amata Corporation. She has 25 years of experience in overseeing more than \$10 billion of assets. She is also the Chairperson on Investment Committee for China's Belt & Road Initiative for Greater Mekong Sub-region.

Ms Ng noted the world situation was in chaos with political and economic tensions as well Speaker as the impact of Covid 19. She gave examples of several women leaders around the world who have shown their mettle in dealing with the Covid 19 situation successfully through their characteristics of being more emphathetic, accepting responsibility, multi-tasking, better communications and authenticity when mistakes were made. Ms Ng further shared the efficient "4P" attributes which she felt would be practical and effective as business leaders, namely 1) Positive outlook, 2) Peace within which could then be brought to the workplace and society, 3) Pragmaticism, 4) People-oriented – addding the employees are assets in order to keep a healthy team.


