In Focus

"Step up to End Polio", a noble fund-raising initiative to 'End Polio'

District 3310 (D3310) organized this wonderful event to create awareness about eradication of Polio and raising funds for 'End Polio'. Launching on 28 August 2020, the event ran over 8 weeks till the World Polio Day on 24 October 2020. Members, their families and friends of the Rotary Club (RC) of Singapore joined this initiative, participated actively in the 'Steps' and 'Weight' challenges, while donating to the End Polio fund generously. More than 50 members participated in the event and RC Singapore raised a handsome amount of USD11,773, which stood at the 2nd highest position among all the participating clubs of D3310. A few members donated several PHFs to 'PolioPlus' during this event.

Club Rotary Foundation Committee (CRFC) – End Polio subcommittee arranged for weekly group walks on Sundays during these 8 weeks in various parks and gardens in Singapore to encourage more participants to join and hence increase the collection of donations. This proved remarkably successful and the number of registered members from initial 25 had doubled within 4 weeks. Due to 'Circuit-Breaker' measures and restriction on social gatherings, strict compliance was ensured by having each group of maximum 5 persons during these weekly walks. This allowed for the members to meet up physically and interact in person, which was missing for many months now since this COVID19 pandemic restricted our club meetings over Zoom sessions only. Although the Step Challenge had 250,000 and 500,000 steps categories only, a few of our members even exceeded 500,000 steps during this event. PP Dr. Yap Lip Kee topped the list with a humongous count of 1,171,443 steps, followed by Dir. Dr. Chan Siew Luen with 772,551 steps. Their performance encouraged all participants to engage in the event and lead a healthy active life as well.

Moreover, during the group walks, prospective new members were invited to showcase Rotary in action and create awareness on Rotary's active role on eradication of Polio globally. Over the course of 8 weeks, some of the invited prospective members had already joined our club as full member.

Towards the end of Step Challenge, PP Perlita Tiro offered her "Collector's End Polio Watch" to raise more funds. We collected a whopping SGD1,533 from a Dutch Auction among the members from this Watch while PP Tan Chin Ngiap made the final bid to win it.

The event was eventually completed on World Polio Day on 24 October 2020 at a group walk in Jurong Lake Gardens, where the District Governor Rajamohan Munisamy joined with few other club members in separate groups. At the closing of the event, District organizers announced to have collected approx. USD60K during this 'Step up to End Polio' event. 
Meeting Report

14th Club Meeting for Rotary Year 2020-2021 held on 21.10.20

KYFR KNOW YOUR FELLOW ROTARIAN

President Dinesh called upon PP Perlita Tiro, the Club's first woman President (RY 2014-15), whom he added we know very well and will know even better after her KYFR presentation.

PP Perlita started with her academic background, followed by her illustrious career spanning 50 years in three companies, SGV & Co, SGV Goh

PP Perlita recalled her Rotary history advising that whilst she joined the Club in March 2000, she actually spoke to the Club some 10 years earlier adding that she would only join our Club when women members were accepted. She added that one of the highlights of her membership was when she was bestowed Rotarian of the Year during PP Tan Chin Ngiap's term (RY2004/05) and when she became a Major Donor of The Rotary Foundation last year.

PP Perlita gave reasons as to why she was in Rotary – for the joy from camaraderie within the Club, District and the Rotary world; and the satisfaction of being of service to the community and bring joy to beneficiaries; giving back for past blessings; developing future generation and continuing learning and self-development. Lastly, PP Perlita took the opportunity to thank her Rotary Mentors for their guidance and advice.

GUEST SPEAKER: DR CHONG MEI SIAN TOPIC: ROAD TO COGNITIVE WELLNESS – A HOLISTIC APPROACH

President Dinesh invited Community Service Director Dr Irina Francken to introduce the Speaker Dr Chong Mei Sian, a Senior Consultant Geriatrician and Medical Director of The Geriatric Practice. She is also visiting consultant to Geriatric Education and Research Institute, Ministry of Health.

Dr Chong highlighted the signs and symptoms of dementia and spoke of the complications of dementia. She noted the importance of early diagnosis and spoke on irreversible causes of dementia. Dr Chong cited recent progress in the dementia field as well as evidence-based dementia prevention strategies. She further spoke on the need to plan ahead and getting in place a Lasting Power of Attorney and Advance Care Planning, if one became incompetent. Dr Chong also gave some advice to caregivers on how to cope in order to prevent burnout.

WELCOME TO ROTARY SCHOLAR




