Singapore Repertory Theatre (SRT) is pleased to announce that we have since launched our Learning & Engagement Website on the 5th of February 2021 with our *Pick-A-Hero* anti-cyberbullying campaign. On our website, you may have a look at the 7-episodes which was directed by Daniel Jenkins (also the playwright) and performed by our Young Company. The 7-episodes can be digested chronologically or in segments as per the school's preference.

Each episode focuses on a different aspect of cyberbullying such as:

Episode 1: Image Alteration

Episode 2: Stereotypes/Public Shaming

Episode 3: Bystander Effect **Episode 4:** Online Harassment

Episode 5: Parental Support/Slamming

Episode 6: Peer Support **Episode 7:** School Support



On the other hand, we have also produced a paid workshop which schools can purchase utilising the episodes and suggested activities. A pilot version of the workshop was also conducted at St. Gabriel's Secondary School for a class of Secondary 1 Normal Technical students.

In the various tabs on the <u>Pick-A-Hero webpage</u> you will notice that it has been divided into the various sections of 'What/When/Where/Who/Why/Resources" in each section you will be able to see more information about the programme.

We invite you to take a look at the website and to share with us your thoughts about the videos/webpage. SRT is very proud of how we have innovated the programme into a digital version during COVID to enable more individuals to engage with the programme through its accessibility and longevity.

GUEST SPEAKER: MR JAN LARSEN

TOPIC: SINGAPORE: SEAT OF MARKET-LEADING FINE ART

To introduce the Speaker, President Dinesh called upon Rtn Ranga Somanathan. Mr Larsen is considered one of the most interesting, entertaining and exciting voices in contemporary art and reflects on the tenor of our times.

He was born in the American Midwest in the "Summer of Love" of 1967. Mr Larsen began his schooling as part of a student-integration programme at a predominantly African-American school in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and proceeded through the American public school system to earn his undergraduate degree from Harvard University and a Master's degree from Oxford University.

Mr Larsen launched his solo career in New York in 2015. His work speaks of his American

moment. In 2019, Mr Larsen began setting up his home-base and production studios for
Asia as a facility he calls Robertson House, near Robertson Quay in River Valley, Singapore, and is joined in his
work by collectors, fellow artists, and institutions in the US, Europe, Asia and Africa.

Prior to his talk, ISC Director Rtn Varun Gulati took the opportunity to thank Mr Larsen for his help and connections with other artists which assisted in raising funds for the "Million Dreams Art Auction" (held on 17 December 2020).

Mr Larsen gave a brief view of his studios and spoke of art appreciation and gave pointers on art collecting. He gave his views and impressions of Singapore's market for find art. He added that art was a way of reflecting on world events and virtues of both Western and Eastern societies through culture and business environments. Mr Larsen also gave some helpful tips on displaying art pieces to optimise the works.

To extend the Club's vote of thanks, President Dinesh invited Rtn Uttam Kripalani who warmly thanked Mr Larsen for his fascinating talk about his art and collection of paintings, installations and sculptures, adding that he learnt a great deal from his creative, artistic interpretation of art.


